PRIMARY IMMUNODEFICIENCIES

This year we have partnered with Primary Immunodeficiency UK (PID UK) a division of Genetic Disorders UK in the production of a leaflet for **Paediatric HLH**.

PIDs stands for primary immunodeficiencies or primary immune deficiencies. People affected by PIDs have parts of their immune systems missing or not working. This leaves them with reduced or no natural defence against germs such as bacteria, fungi and viruses, which surround us every day.

The consequences are that people with PIDs get infections more often than is normal; they can take longer to get better when they have antibiotic treatment and even then, the infections can keep coming back.

Share Your Voice

Because of Blake



In memory of our beautiful boy Blake who sadly lost his life to the most horrendous disease, Hemophagocytic lymphohistiocytosis or HLH.

From the moment our son Blake was born he flooded our hearts with love. As a baby he was so cuddly and adorable. As a toddler he was so bright, cheerful and adventurous and when he started school he came into his own, showing how fantastic he was at everything he did. But at five years old Blake was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia. His treatment started straight away, with six months of intensive chemotherapy and a planned further three years of maintenance chemotherapy. There were a few initial complications, but Blake responded well to the treatment

and went into remission really quickly. In September 2017, part way through his maintenance treatment, Blake started to get progressively ill. He always struggled with vomiting through treatment, but this worsened along with shingles, nose bleeds, total loss of appetite and an unstoppable thirst. He was finally hospitalised at the beginning of November 2017 when his temperature spiked. His illness baffled the doctors and consultants, he was tested for everything they could think of including diabetes insipidus, but nothing of note came back apart from he tested positive for rhinovirus. Within one week at hospital he became seriously ill and his liver started to fail. He was, at this point, transferred to intensive care and put on life support. Here he was diagnosed with Hemophagocytic lymphohistiocytosis (HLH). We had never heard of this life-threatening disease. We were told that it was highly unlikely that Blake would survive this as he was so seriously ill. He needed dialysis as he was storing fluid all over his body. His blood pressure medication was at the highest dose. He needed constant blood products as his blood was not clotting. He also had a CT scan which showed small bleeds on his brain. Blake was given all the treatment that was available. Firstly steroids, and then chemotherapy. Blake did not respond to any of the treatment he was given and needed the maximum level of life support. It was too big a fight for Blake. Our perfect boy sadly passed away on 30 November 2017, seven years old, to this terrible disease. It is an understatement to say our world has been shattered and our hearts have been truly broken, words cannot express the pain and heartache we are going through.

To help us keep going and honour our beautiful boy we are fundraising for Histio UK. We want to help the charity to support patients and their families and also raise awareness, especially for HLH. This illness is so rare and so deadly we feel Histio UK needs our support to be able to help save the lives of other children who are so unlucky to be struck by HLH. This deadly disease needs to be stopped!

So, what are we going to do?

To raise money for Histio UK we plan to fundraise every year. This year a core group of Blake's family and friends are doing 'The Big Eight' as it would be Blake's eighth birthday. This means eight gruelling events between a core team of eight people. This will include A Cyclothon, A Swimathon, The Three Yorkshire Peaks, The Three National Peaks (in 24 hours), Total Warrior, A Total Wipe Out Style Obstacle Course, A Walk to Barnsley Hospital Tied Together and The Hedgehog Half Marathon. All the events will have a meaningful link to Blake and details are continually posted on our Facebook page Because.Of.Blake

We are also holding a charity evening which will be a meal, auction and raffle.

These events are seriously pushing us out of our comfort zone. We need to support Histio UK – no child should ever have to go through what Blake did. Support this charity, Support Blake.
